

Fabretto Community Well-Being & Development

Introduction

Fabretto's community programs create supportive environments in which children and families can thrive by strengthening community health, knowledge, and infrastructure.

Underserved Nicaraguan communities lack access to public health services, and many peri-urban and rural communities still do not have access to potable water and electricity. Public infrastructure, including schools and water systems, becomes run down without consistent maintenance. Through strategic partnerships and connections to resources, Fabretto addresses these critical issues by mobilizing communities through development projects and community education.

The Program

Fabretto's goal is to **create safe and healthy communities** so that children and families can prosper. Fabretto spreads knowledge of public health through workshops for parents, teachers, and students on preventative health, oral hygiene, water and sanitation, and environmental issues. Through these workshops, community members learn how to **prevent illnesses** and improve health and hygiene at home and in schools.

Students receive treatment for common illnesses and parasites, and Fabretto connects students with special health needs to resources to help them learn and grow alongside their peers.

Fabretto assembles groups of students and community members to conduct community clean ups, health campaigns, and more. With support from partner organizations, Fabretto **improves public infrastructure**, including expanding classrooms, fixing water systems, and repairing school facilities.
