Letter from the Chief Executive Officer

Dear Friends,

2024 was an incredible year of expansion and deepening of Fabretto's impact in Guatemala and Honduras.

Together with eight core impact partners, as well as other friends, partner organizations, and donors, we have collectively served thousands of children and youth in Central America through Fabretto's programs.

Our programs - centered on Education, Nutrition, and Youth Development respond to needs that our partners and their communities have identified. We collaborate to develop impactful projects that meet real demands and bring opportunities to children and youth.

In 2024, we grew several strategic initiatives, including our signature agricultural skills development program for youth and the technology integration project in rural schools. The network of partners in the nutrition program also grew, bringing fortified foods to more school kitchens in areas with high rates of child malnutrition. Additionally,

Fabretto brought together our network to advocate for rural education and youth development through events like the Regional Rural Education Summit and the Fabretto Innova youth exchange program.

Internally, Fabretto continues to build out our talented team and have welcomed new team members from Guatemala and Honduras. We also launched two giving clubs to recognize our donors - the Friends of Fabretto Loyalty Circle and Legado: the Padre Fabretto Legacy Society. Your steadfast commitment to our mission has made all the difference in this new chapter for Fabretto.

We are forever grateful for the support and trust from the "Familia Fabretto" - thank you for being a part of 2024, and I hope you will join us as we continue to grow our impact in 2025.



PARTNER SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT

The San José School joined Fabretto's Child Sponsorship program in 2023. Our partner ACOES runs the center, which in 2024 provided access to education and nutrition to 15 preschoolers, 18 kindergarteners, and 14 primary school students.

Fabretto Child Sponsors have sponsored 14 students at San José. Together, Fabretto and ACOES are working to bring opportunities to the community. The center is located on the outskirts of Tegucigalpa, where parents typically work in the informal economy to make ends meet and access to services is limited.

NUTRITION IN ACTION: PARTNER SPOTLIGHT

In 2024, Seeds for Progress joined Fabretto's Nutrition program, reaching 11 communities and more than 1,400 individuals with the "MannaPack" fortified soy product. Seeds trained more than 300 parents on how to prepare healthy school meals.

This initiative supported the rural schools where Seeds works, as well as a special "Coffee Camp" program designed to provide children with a safe place to learn during coffee harvest season and prevent child labor. Seeds also worked with community members to identify special cases to provide extra nutrition to children with the greatest need.

BRINGING OPPORTUNITIES TO RURAL YOUTH IN HONDURAS

Since Padre Fabretto first traveled to Nicaragua, our work has centered on bringing opportunities to rural youth. Today, we are opening doors through education and training, alongside our partners in Honduras.

Fabretto's CATEC Technical Training Courses are a youth empowerment program that combines technical training with personal development, using a hands-on learning approach. Through these courses, youth build technical skills relevant to the local agricultural production or labor market, while also developing soft skills.

PROJECT SPOTLIGHT: STRENGTHENING RURAL SECONDARY EDUCATION

Collaborating to Strengthen Rural Secondary Education in Honduras

Together with local partner Bayan, Fabretto worked to strengthen the quality of the Sistema de Aprendizaje Tutorial (SAT) program and expand its reach in Honduras. SAT is a rural secondary education program that serves 158 schools in 10 departments of Honduras, reaching a total of **6,385 students** in 2024.

MEET KARLA, YOUTH ENTREPRENEUR FROM LEMPIRA, HONDURAS

Karla enrolled in Fabretto's b-learning entrepreneurship course in 2023, and in 2024, she has taken her business to the next level. Using plantains produced at her family's farm, she created her own brand of chips and has grown from a first production of 100 bags to 450 bags a month, even hiring an assistant to meet demand for her products.

In 2024, Fabretto and BAYAN organized a youth entrepreneurship fair in Gracias, Lempira featuring 17 projects led by youth like Karla. The project also provided startup materials and technical assistance to students to help them grow their businesses.

Advocating for Rural Education at the Rural Education Summit & Workshop in May 2024





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In May 2024, Fabretto and BAYAN held the first "Rural Education Summit" in Honduras to highlight SAT's contributions to education in the region. The meeting brought together a diverse set of organizations and representatives from countries such as Guatemala, Nicaragua, Colombia, and the United States to celebrate the 50th anniversary of SAT. The Summit was co-financed by contributions from the Inter-American Foundation (IAF), UNICEF Honduras, and other generous donors to Fabretto.

Day 1 of the Summit included speeches and panels that highlighted the founding of SAT by FUNDAEC in Colombia, the importance of SAT as a vehicle for social development, and SAT's impact. Without a doubt, the most moving moments of the day were the testimonials from SAT students. graduates, and tutors, who shared how the program has transformed their lives.

On Day 2, Fabretto invited partners from the region to share experiences and to visit a SAT school. The event generated connections that have led to collaborations within the Fabretto network of partners and increased fundraising opportunities. We are proud to continue collaborating with BAYAN and the Secretary of Education to advocate for SAT and strengthen its reach across Honduras.

In August 2024, Fabretto organized the "Fabretto Innova" Summit in Siguatepeque, Honduras to bring together youth leaders from across the country and learn how to use Design Thinking to innovate and improve their communities.


